Returning to Church

The following changes to our present way of working are based on our response of 22nd August to the Bishops' letter of 10th August.

The basic points of our response were:

- The bishops are emphasising that aerosols are a bigger danger of infection than surfaces.
- Ensuring Good Ventilation.
- Maintaining good hygiene on entering and leaving the church.
- Practising respiratory hygiene and cough etiquette
- Wearing masks or face coverings.
- Test and Protection is to be maintained.
- As far as we are aware we are still to keep the Mass to a moderate length so that the congregation is not in the church longer than necessary.
- We will keep the 1 metre distancing for the present, though we will adapt if necessary by putting two people into the presently sealed off benches.
- We are still to avoid congregating or crushing together.
- *We would like to add: **Whatever other changes happen we will do everything to avoid having the churches so full that some might feel uncomfortable or apprehensive.***

The following proposals are made in line with the Bishops' letter and our analysis of the needs of the parish. Please feel free to comment on them; we will be monitoring the effectiveness of them regularly. As always we will be evaluating them in the light of the infection rate.

Booking: In line with the proposals of the bishops **we will cancel our booking system** starting this weekend 25th/26th September. Please come in good time for Mass, as if the numbers go up the passkeepers will have to have time to help parishioners to seats. We think it is important to try and fill up the church from the front, so that we can see which seats are free. We ask your co-operation with this.

Test and Protect: Legally we have to fulfil the requirements of the Test and Protect scheme. To help us do this we have drawn up lists of people who are normally at a particular Mass. If you normally go to a particular Mass please check your name is on the list. After that you don't have to do anything, other than if on a particular week you are not going to be at that Mass phone the present mobile **(07546454419)**, formerly for booking, or email the parish. If you are at a different Mass or have a visitor please sign in at the back of the church.

Sanitising the churches: In line with the bishops' comments that the main danger of infection is air borne aerosols, we will work at increasing the airflow through our churches. We will reduce the work and effort required with regard to sanitising the churches. Each church is cleaned thoroughly every week. Holy Cross will also be sanitised after the 9.30am Mass. St. Margaret Mary's will also be sanitised after the 11.30am Mass and after the 1.00pm Mass. Both churches will be sanitised after funeral Masses, Baptisms and special Masses.

Offertory procession and bringing back our servers: Because of the present high rate of infection we are delaying these for several weeks. Do however contact Fr. Hand now if you are interested in serving.

The other points of our letter of the 22nd August still stand, including Communion is still to be
