Parish Development

Following the Parish General Meeting the temporary pastoral council and the pastoral council renewal group have met and propose the following developments:

The new pastoral council will start at the beginning of October. For the present it will consist of 8 members and the parish priest. It will be prepared for by a sub group finalising the basic purposes of a pastoral council, and then a period of recruitment and formation. It is important to see that any pastoral council will work in the context of meetings of group leaders meetings , , group meetings, parish general meetings. This will be developed next week.

Census: We are doing a major update of our parish records. This is important as we need to know the names and contact details of our parishioners in order to develop contact with them. It is also important in helping us get some idea of the make up of our congregation. One of the organising group will explain about this in the next few weeks.

Parish Information and Welcoming Folder: A parish folder including basic information about the parish that would be useful to all parishioners, and especially new one, will be developed for general parish use. A parish directory of all groups will be developed in course of the year.

We pray for Theresa Cameron who was buried on Wednesday 10th June at 12.00 noon in Mount Vernon.

We pray Michele Gallo, whose Funeral Mass was in Holy Cross church on Thursday 11th June, and his funeral service took place at 11.00am on the same day at Warriston Crematorium.

What to do now that we have completed our SCIAF Zambian project. Our aim over two years was to raise £12,000 and we have done that in one year. Because of the pressing financial needs of the parish with special attention to St Margaret Mary's Church, we have decided to discontinue the project now. There are several ways of acting:

- The SCIAF collections will be stopped as of now and we will replace several of these collections with ones for the roof fund.
- People donating by Standing Order can stop their donations through contacting the bank to tell them to stop.
- Standing Order donors may want to transfer the destination of their donation through to the Roof fund.
- Gift orders can be stopped or increased at any time.

There will be people at the back of the Church to ask for information or help.

A Tainted Legacy: A member of L'Arche reflects on the legacy of Jean Vanier, six years on:

A tainted legacy expresses the situation confronting L'Arche across the world since the shameful double-life of its founder, Jean Vanier, was exposed in February 2020. For an international network of 150 plus communities who were long content to bask in Vanier's reflected glory, the impact has felt 'an overdue crash course in humility'.

It's a painful issue too for the many individuals whose lives had been shaped by a man once considered a spiritual giant, spoken of by some as a saint even within his lifetime. For them, grief has come twice over: first after Vanier's natural death, and then again, a few months later, after the death of his reputation. How does anyone begin to sift the wheat from the weeds?
